# **Declaration of Intent**

The participants attending the meeting *Long Networks*, *Ecomuseums and Europe*, Trento, May 5-8, 2004.

Having agreed that

an Ecomuseum is a dynamic way in which communities preserve, interpret, and manage their heritage for a sustainable development. An Ecomuseum is based on a community agreement.

State their intention to set up the EUROPEAN NETWORK OF ECOMUSEUMS

The participants of the meeting do further agree on the following points.

- 1) Issues of common interest:
  - a) local identity;
  - b) involving the local community;
  - c) status and role of the Ecomuseum;
  - d) training and education;
  - e) developing sustainable traditional and non/intrusive production activities and services;
  - f) fund-raising;
  - g) networking; and
  - h) research.
- 2) The strategies to develop and investigate the themes listed above will be mainly based on the following strategies:
  - a) paying mutual visits to the other ecomuseums to start collaborations and identify latent potentials of the partners;
  - b) creating task-forces and research groups
  - c) provide mutual support to local round tables; and
  - d) maintaining communications among those who signed the agreement (website, e-mail, electronic discussion forum).

## May 2004

Shared declaration of intent.

#### October 2004

- To finalise the analysis of the most suited instruments in the framework of UE initiatives.
- Presentation of a project for a UE initiative to set up an European network.

## February 2005

- List of basic common elements which characterise the ecomuseums.
- Presentation of conclusions by task-forces.

## May 2005

Presentation of the ecomuseums network website.

## September 2005

- First European Congress on Ecomuseums.
- Guidebook to ecomuseums member of the network.
